Bassetlaw District Council's Sports Development Service works in partnership with other agencies and organisations to achieve the key aim of getting "More Bassetlaw People Becoming More Active More Often".

SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS APRIL 2008 - MARCH 2009

More People

- 25 people with a disability attended the fun swimming gala.
- 231 new referrals received into the "Go For Fit" Scheme.
- 17 primary school teachers qualified through a "Elevating Athletics" course.
- 174 secondary school students qualified as assistant athletics officials linked to Sports Hall Athletics.
- 18 young people not in education, employment or training engaged with Sporting Chance sessions.
- 10 young sports leaders attended a training day related to the outreach rural school holiday schemes.
- 213 Sports leaders assisted with voluntary hours to help officiate at sporting events organised by sports development.
- 1097 young people participated in the "Footballing Chance" Project



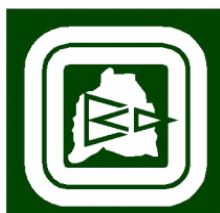
More Active

- 64 young people attended P.A.Y.P. (Positive Activities for Young People) sessions delivered by Sporting chance with a total of 4,483 hours being achieved.
- 10 different hot spot areas for youth anti social behaviour received sessions delivered by Footballing Chance.
- 180 new people attended Walkabout Clumber Park walks on Sunday mornings.
- 58 swimmers in the Bassetlaw Swim Squads, 14 achieving regional qualifying times, 6 qualifying with National Championship times.
- 4,424 units of Multi-Skill coaching was delivered to primary school children across Bassetlaw.
- 658 children attended Bassetlaw Youth Games events.



More Often

- 53 Footballing Chance sessions were delivered in Day Care Centres.
- 38 swim with a purpose sessions for people with a disability were delivered.
- 74 SAND sports club sessions delivered with an overall attendance of 684 participants
- 10 school holiday swimming sessions were delivered at Misterton Pool with 385 attendances.
- 9 workshops delivered linked to qualifying secondary school pupils as assistant athletics officials.
- 52 sessions of seated exercise were delivered in rural communities with an overall attendance of 800.
- 27 days of outreach rural school holiday schemes were delivered at various locations across the district.

Positive Activities for Young People

CASE STUDY

Outreach Rural School Holiday Programme.

This Programme has been developed by Bassetlaw District Council's Sports Development Team and aims to deliver high quality sports coaching in rural community settings in order to give children from those areas the



chance to take part in sport and to break down the barriers to participation caused by cost and transport.

The programme operates during school holidays (Feb, May and Oct half terms and the Easter and summer breaks) and runs for 3 mornings per week. It is promoted through posters, leaflets, school assemblies and on the Sports Development website.

Over the past year the Outreach Rural Activity Programme has been delivered to 223 children aged between 6 – 11yrs in eight rural communities: - Gamston, East Markham, Misterton, Elkesley, North Wheatley, Beckingham, Dunham on Trent and Normanton on Trent.

The Programme has undergone extensive changes. Last year delivery was to 4 – 7 year olds and 8 – 11 year olds but current sessions are aimed at the 6 – 11 year age group who take part together.

At present each session consists of 90 minutes of sports coaching delivered by Sports Leaders and Sports Development Staff and 90 minutes delivered by local sports club coaches. This enables children to take part in many sports and to meet the coaches from the local sports clubs they may want to join in the future. The programme is continually changed to ensure that the children will enjoy and return to future sessions.

STAFFING
