Employment Land Survey 2003-2004

Introduction

On an annual basis Bassetlaw District Council undertakes a detailed survey and analysis of employment land take-up and availability of land to meet future development requirements. The information gained is published and made available to the general public and the development industry.

Purpose of the Report

The results of the survey and analysis are used as a basis for monitoring the performance of the Nottinghamshire Structure Plan and Bassetlaw Local Plan policies. It will also provide useful information for the private sector in formulating their own future policies. In addition it helps to inform the Council's Economic Development Units in its development of policy to ensure a strong and healthy economy.

The Survey

The survey considers the development of sites subject to planning permission and includes land, which is allocated for employment in the Local Plan and contained within areas of existing employment. In addition sites are given a classification of undeveloped or previously developed, reflecting the importance that is now placed on the redevelopment of disused sites in national local planning guidance.

Overall Summary

Take-up

In the west of the district a total of 1.3ha of allocated employment land was taken-up, leaving 128.3ha remaining to be developed during the plan period. In the east of the district no allocated employment land was taken-up, therefore a total of 43.5ha of allocated land remains to be developed.

The majority of remaining allocated land is identified for B1, B2 and B8 use. (Business use, offices, research development, any industrial process which has no detriment to the amenity of an area, general industrial uses, storage or distribution). Within the district, primarily concentrated in Worksop, there remains an additional 33.1ha of available land located on protected employment land.

Therefore there is a total of 203.6ha of employment land, either allocated, protected or existing, available in the Bassetlaw District as a whole, the majority (84%) being located on allocated sites, as identified in the Bassetlaw Local Plan.

It is important to note that 40% of the total land available comes from two major sites, the ex Manton Colliery and Bevercotes Colliery and that together they provide a gross figure of 86ha or approximately 60% of the Brownfield total. Early development of one or both of these sites will mean the reserve of Brownfield land will be greatly diminished.

Glossary

Greenfield - Land which has not been previously developed

Full/Detailed Planning Permission - Permission granted for a specified employment related development

Outline Planning Permission - Permission granted where the principle of employment development has been accepted

Protected Employment Land - Land that is protected for employment use in the Bassetlaw Local Plan

Site Area – The size of an area allocated or with permission for employment (identified in hectares)

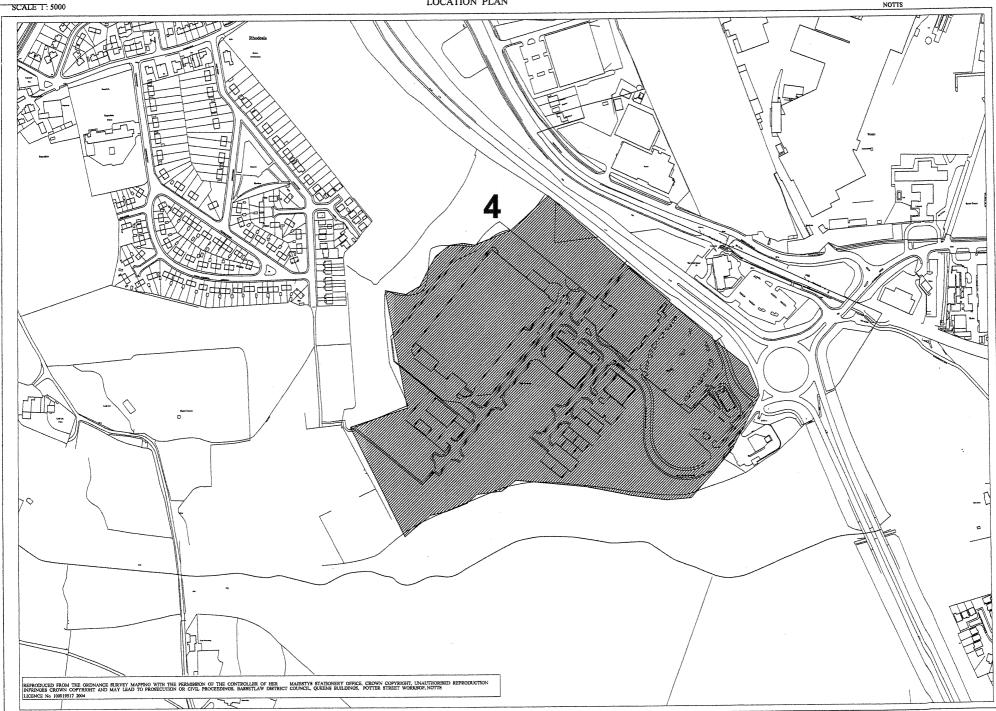

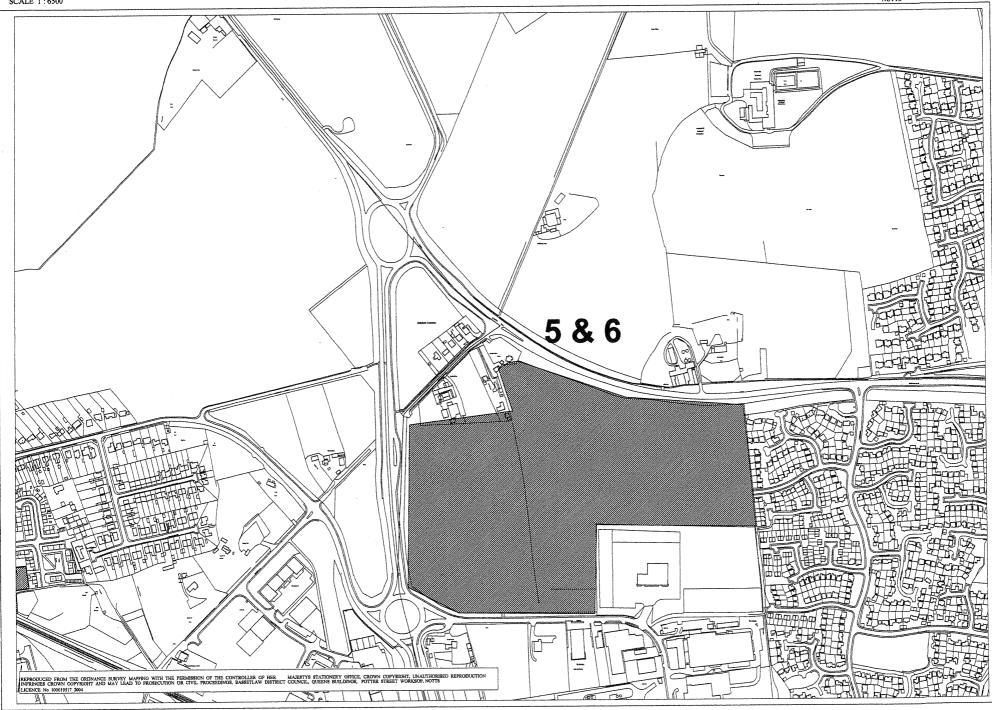

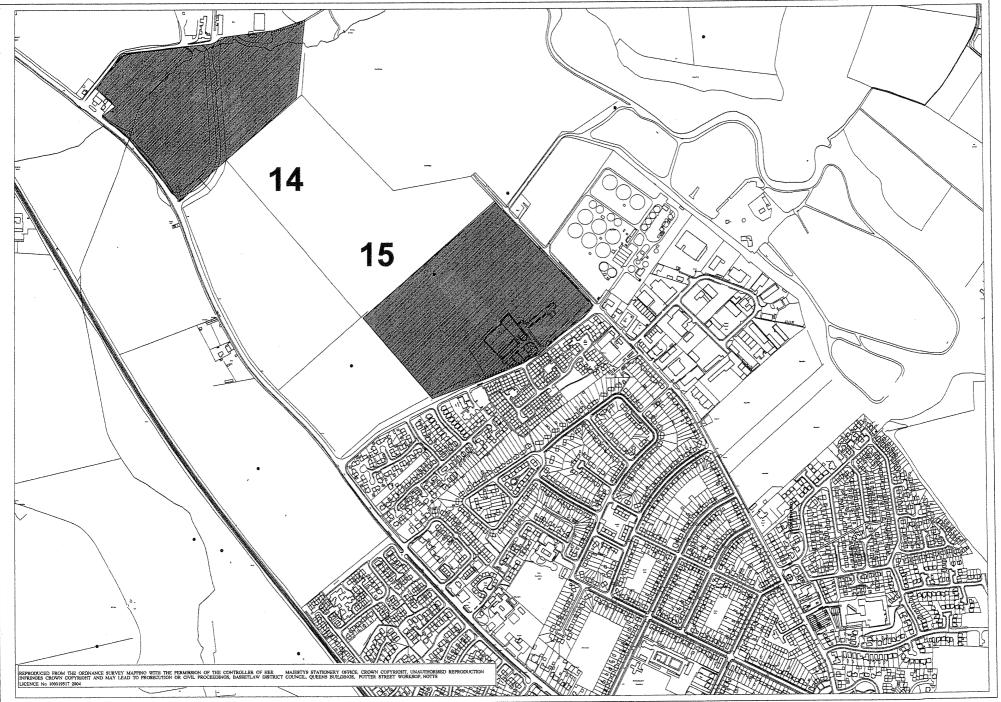
QUEENS BUILDINGS POTTER STREET WORKSOP NOTTS

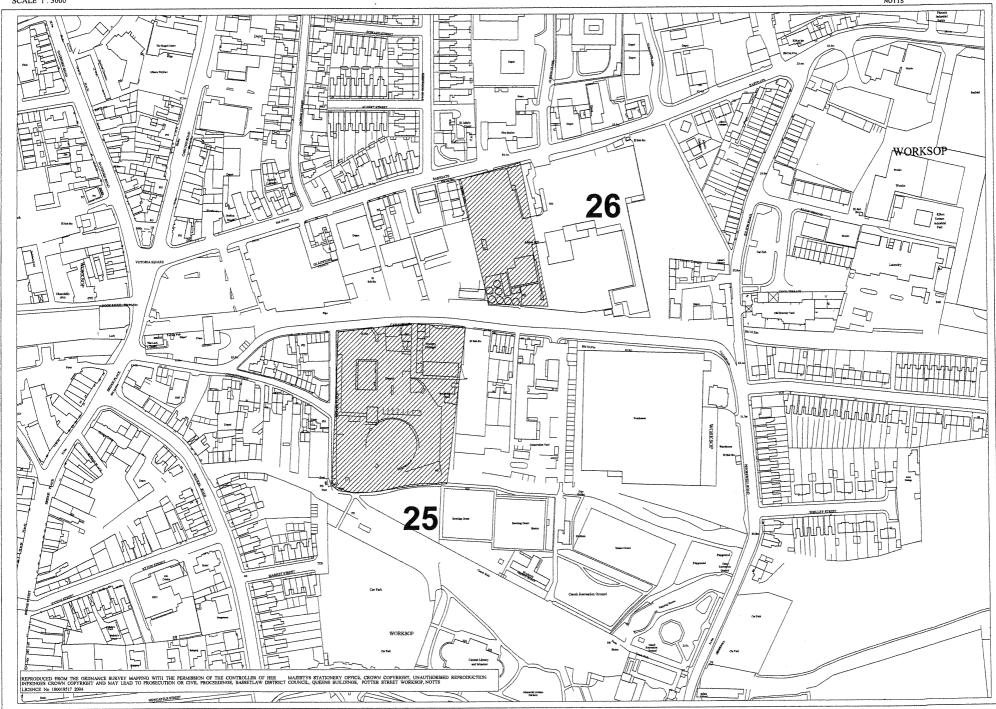
QUEENS BUILDINGS POTTER STREET WORKSOP NOTTS

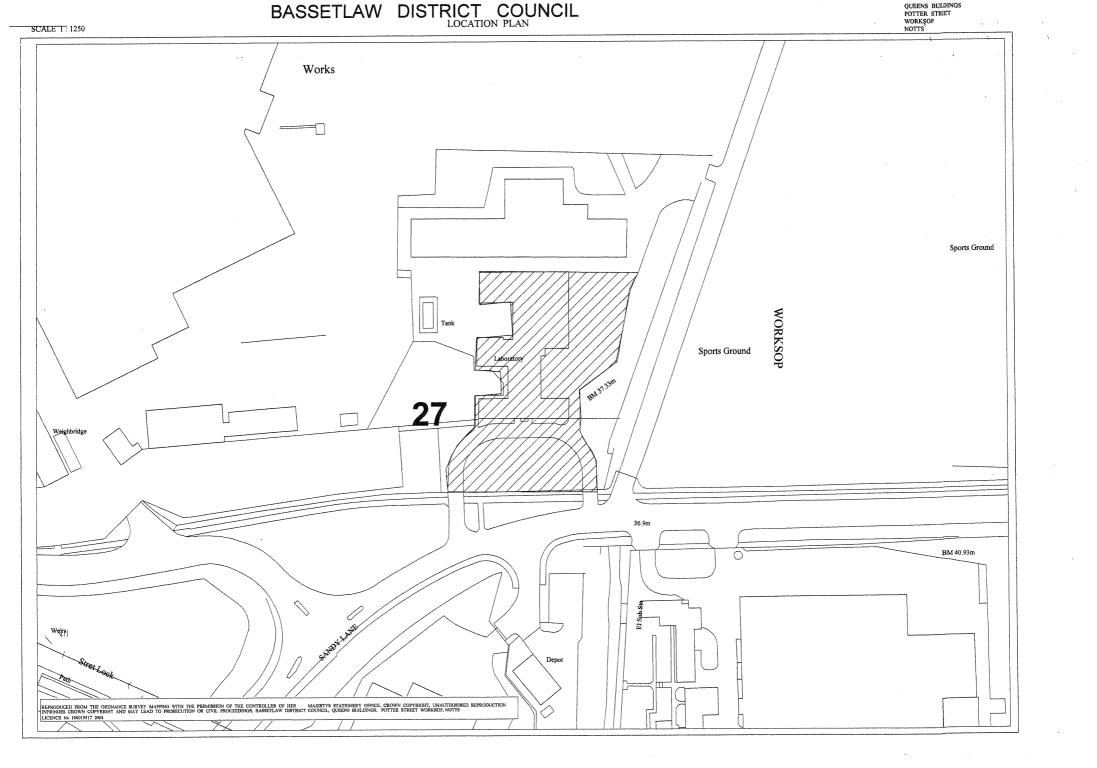

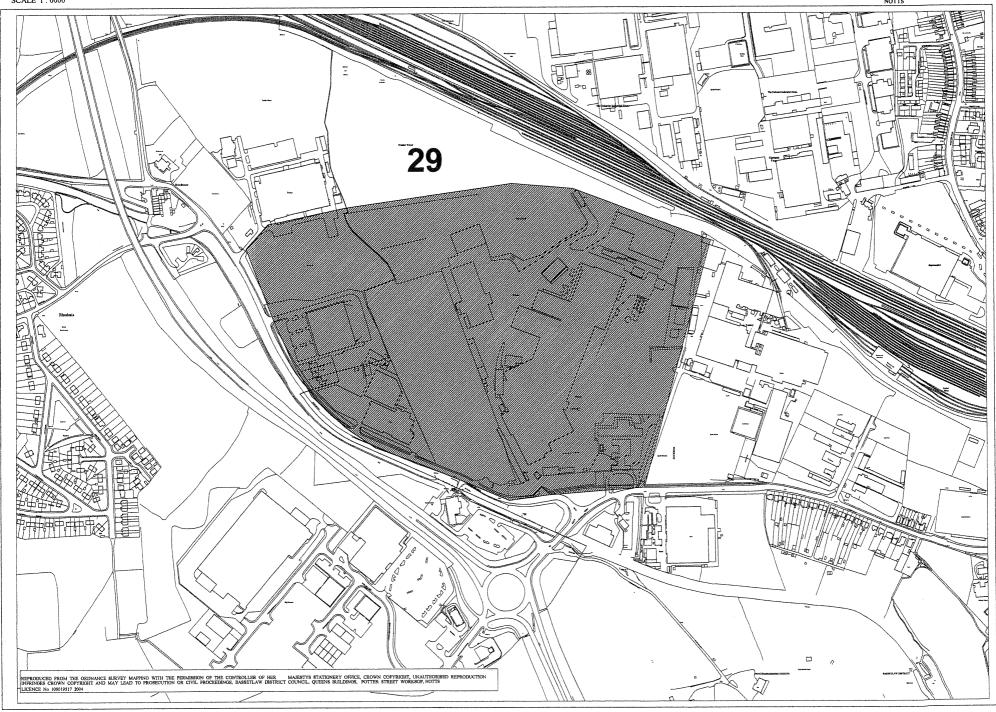

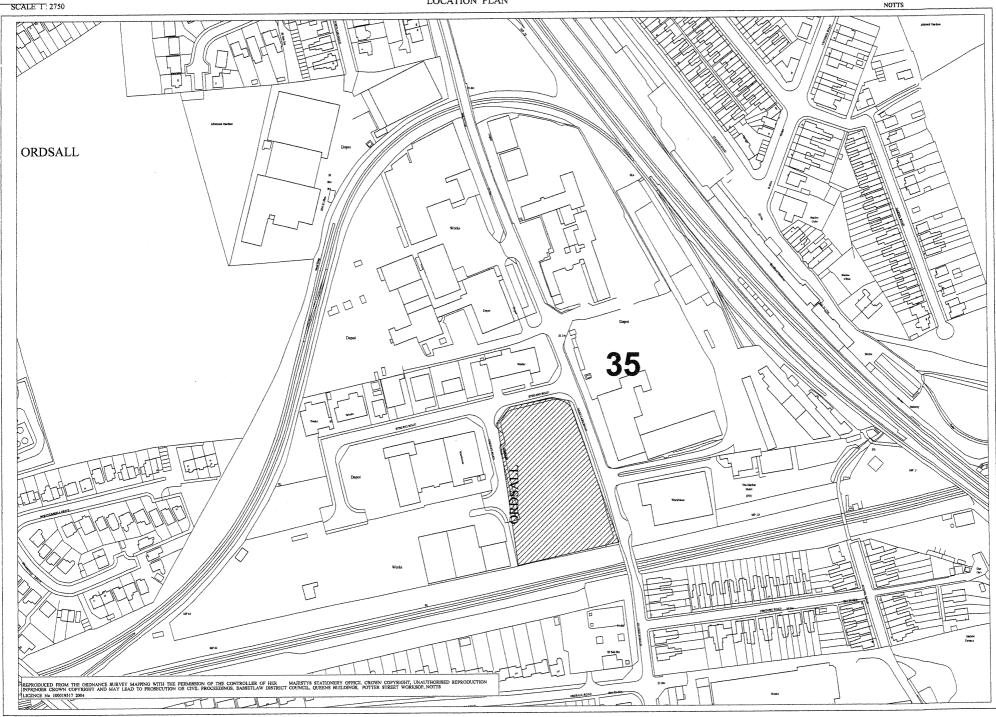
