Key Achievements:

- Referral to the Diabetes Education and Self-Management for On-going and Newly Diagnosed (DESMOND Programme);
- Information Prescriptions and annual foot checks are a requirement as part of the Local Enhanced Service which the majority of GPs have signed up to.
- All GPs are sign posting patients to the free NHS Health Check.
- Specialist Foot Clinic started at Bassetlaw Hospital October 2011.
- Raised staff awareness - advertised in the staff Health & Well-Being newsletter summer 2011 and at the October, 2011 Health Fair
- NHS Bassetlaw is working with community groups and organised a joint event with Diabetes UK in September 2010 and October 2011.
- Bassetlaw District Council, in partnership with Barnsley Premier Leisure (BPL) and NHS Bassetlaw have promoted diabetes awareness in the leisure centres.
- Type 2 diabetes remains a referral criteria for the Exercise on Referral scheme.
- Promotional material is displayed in support of Diabetes Week.

Reasons for partially implementing recommendations:

- Locally Enhanced Service (LES) for Diabetes to provide consistent standards across the GPs in the District was launched in October. Nine practices have signed up, two are intending to do so and NHS Bassetlaw is working with the final practice.
