Any person(s) may also inspect and make copies of these documents.
- 2. A local government elector (that is anyone who has a right to vote in local Government elections for Bassetlaw District Council) or his/her representative, may ask the auditor questions about the accounts. Please contact the auditor at the address above to make arrangements to ask any questions.
- 3. A local government elector for the area of the Council, or his/her representative, may object to the Council's accounts asking that the auditor issue a report in the public interest (under section 27 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014) and/or apply to the court for a declaration that an item in the accounts is contrary to law (under section 28 of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014). A local elector who wishes to make an objection must send to the auditor at the address above, a written notice setting out the objection and the grounds on which it is made and must send a copy of that notice to the Council for the attention of the Chief Executive at the address below.
