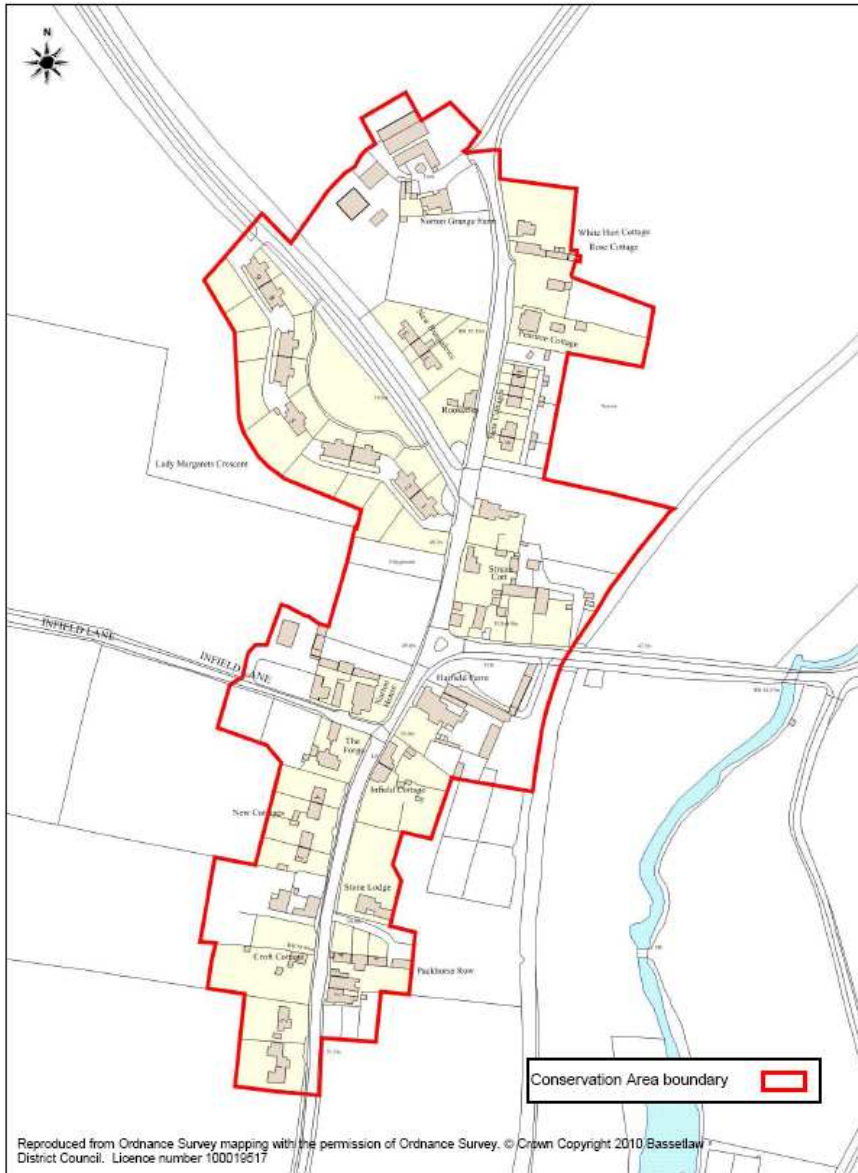
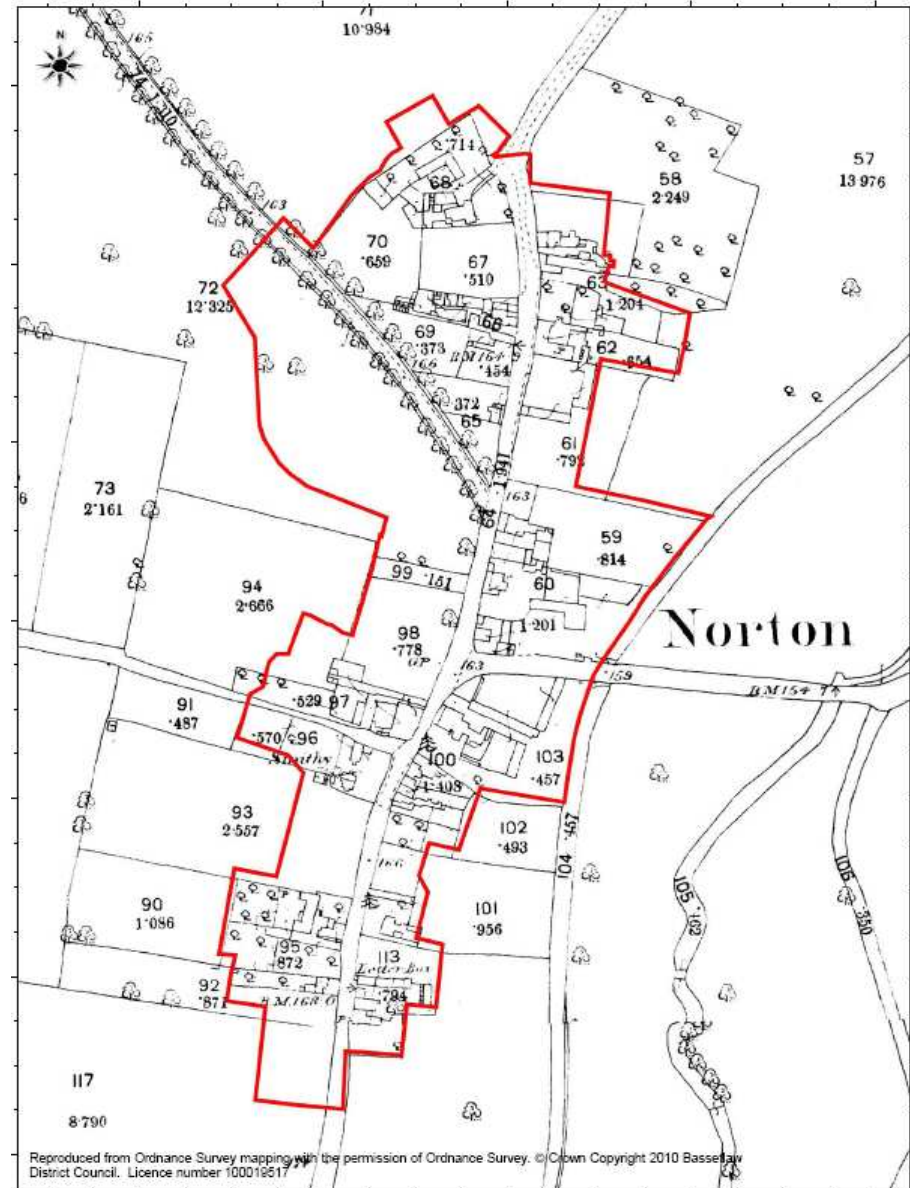

## Norton

Norton is a small close-knit hamlet a mile northeast of Cuckney. Many buildings are listed, with most others complementing their group setting. Norton possesses a strong estate village character, with estate housing, historic cottages and farmsteads.

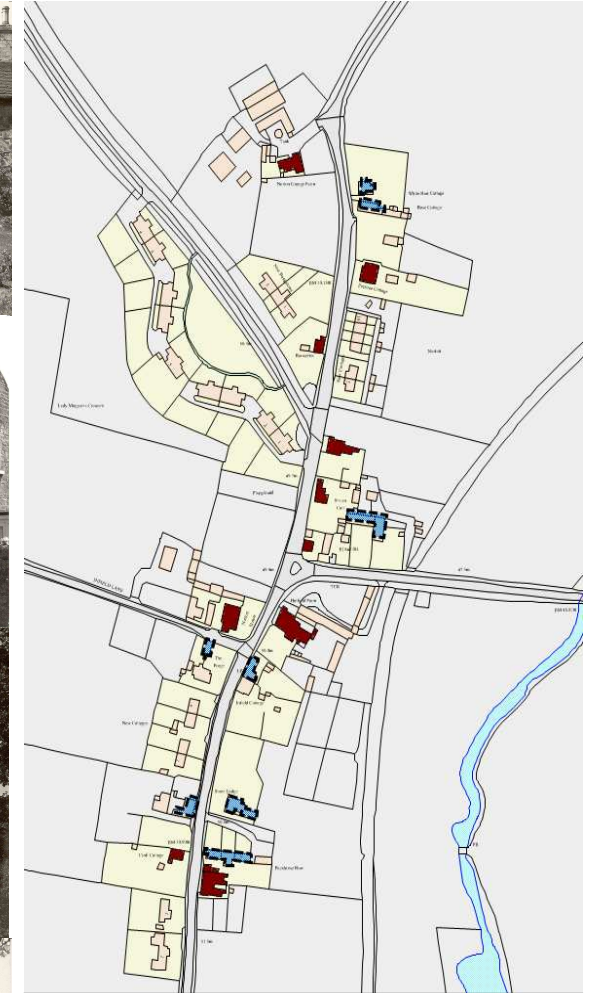


1 Carburton Road (Grade II listed) and the green make an attractive focal point (source: North East Midlands Photographic Record, 2009).

Boundaries are generally very attractive, including stone walls, green verges and estate fencing. The small village green at the corner of Carburton Road is a nice focal point for this beautiful village.

Architectural interest, both in form, detailing and materials is strong throughout the settlement and the layout and form of buildings ensures that there is a unified historic character.
